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Year 7 Prayer Program

Prayer holds a great significance in the life of a practicing Muslim, which is why ICOM held an intense Prayer Program for the Year 7's. The program was divided into two parallel parts:

Practical Component:

Activity: Year 7 students engage in individual prayer at designated isolated locations.

Supervision: Each session is overseen by the college Imam and the Islamic Studies Teacher.

Objective: To provide hands-on experience in prayer, allowing students to practice in a controlled environment while receiving immediate feedback.

Curriculum Component:

Content: Islamic Studies lessons are focused on perfecting prayer (Salah) and ablution (wudu), along with practical lessons related to prayer.

Goal: To reinforce theoretical knowledge and ensure students understand the correct procedures and the significance of each component of prayer.

The goal of the Prayer Program is to to supervise and correct students' prayer practices, identify and address mistakes, helping students learn and improve and to ensure that students can perform prayers correctly and independently by the end of the program.

Upon successful completion, students received a prayer license, symbolizing their proficiency and understanding of prayer practices. This comprehensive approach ensures that students are well-prepared to perform their prayers correctly, combining both practical experience and theoretical knowledge.

On Friday, August 2nd, students took part in the Year Three Movie Night. The event was designed to help students enhance their social and independent skills.


Prior to the movie night, students were surveyed to choose between two pizza flavours: Margherita or BBQ chicken.

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What is Material?

In general material is a substance or mixture of substances that constitutes an object. Material can be pure or impure.

Year 4 at the Werribee Zoo

What an adventure the year 4 students and staff had visiting the Werribee Zoo.

Our trip to the zoo had us taking a trip to the African Savannah, engaging in hands-on activities and discovering the features of African predators and their prey. We learnt what adaptions predators have to hunt successfully and how the prey have developed to give them a fighting chance. Students analysed skulls and investigated what it takes for these animals to survive. We thoroughly enjoyed our behind the scenes look at the habitat of the African wild dog.

Students enjoyed walking around the Werribee zoo and visiting the different animals and playgrounds along the way. A favourite was the safari bus, the animals were so close we could almost touch them. Overall, we had a successful excursion learning many new facts and information about animals.

Year 3: Earth, Sun and Moon Show

On Wednesday, July 31, and Thursday, August 1, the Year Three students attended the 'Earth, Sun, and Moon' excursion at Scienceworks. The goal of the excursion was to explain how Earth's rotation on its axis affects the daynight cycle and why we have seasons on Earth.

The day included the 'Earth, Sun, and Moon Show,' a visit to the general viewing area, and a Planetarium show.

The first part of the excursion was the "Earth, Sun, and Moon Show," a science presentation featuring visual equipment and interactive demonstrations. This show explained how Earth's rotation influences the day-night cycle and the reasons behind Earth's seasons. Students were actively engaged and enjoyed participating by answering questions and modelling parts of the session for their peers.

Next, students explored the general viewing area, which included "Sportsworks" and "Think Ahead," both offering numerous hands-on activities.

Finally, they concluded the excursion with the Planetarium show 'Tilt'. This show explained how the tilt of Earth's axis, combined with its orbit around the Sun, causes the four seasons and how the length of day and seasons vary across different parts of the Earth, from the poles to the equator.
